Measuring Central Universities' Research Contribution to the Nation (India): An Assessment of ETDs (Shodhganga)

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Background: Information and communication technology (ICT) has significantly impacted the way people search, gather, and disseminate information. Grey literature, which includes research not widely published or with limited non-commercial publication, includes important sources like dissertations and theses. Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETD) have significantly impacted this process. The University Grants Commission Notification, published on June 1, 2009, mandates Indian researchers to submit electronic copies of their theses and dissertations for free access to the global academic community. Universities can receive UGC funding to digitize their research backlog by signing Memorandums of Understanding with the INFLIBNET Center and making electronic copies available to Shodhganga. Students must submit their theses and dissertations online to meet this requirement. While it can be a useful source of data for research, it is crucial to remember that there are other metrics that should be utilized to evaluate a university's contribution to national research. Shodhganga is a repository for Indian Ph.D. theses, while INFLIBNET collects and makes research available through its network. This project facilitates effective sharing and accessibility of research findings within the academic community. The Shodhganga repository now has 482492 full-text theses and dissertations uploaded (till September 5, 2023), and 840 universities have signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and are contributing to it.



OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

- CATEGORIZE THE THESES: The study examines the research landscape in Central Universities by analyzing ETD uploads to Shodhganga in 2022.
- ASSESSING LANGUAGE DISTRIBUTION, departmental classification, evaluating interdisciplinary collaboration, and setting performance benchmarks.
- ANALYZE THE DATA: Determine how many ETDs were submitted by each Central university in order to analyze the data.
- COMPARE THE CENTRAL UNIVERSITIES ETDS: It's critically important to compare university contributions to research, such as the number of ETDs uploaded.

It is crucial to keep in mind that these aims may change based on the particular environment and objectives of the evaluation done on the research contributions made by central institutions through ETDs in Shodhganga.

Methods: The methodology for gathering information about Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETDs) from central universities involved thorough searching on Shodhganga, organizing the data into an Excel spreadsheet, and selecting specific universities to ensure accurate representation. To avoid having the same data twice, the researchers chose universities unique in their states. It is important to note that some newer central universities may not have uploaded their ETDs yet on Shodhganga, as they are still in the early stages of development. The data was organized and carefully selected to avoid duplicates. The study emphasizes the importance of carefully selecting and organizing data to ensure accurate representation of central universities.




Table 3 and Figure 2 displays Central Universities by state, establishment year, centralized status, and ETDs available, totaling 940 ETDs across these universities.

The table presents the number of Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETDs) in various languages. English is the most dominant language with 793 ETDs. Hindi has 84 ETDs, while Sanskrit has 27 ETDs. Nepali has 7 ETDs, indicating research conducted in Nepali or focusing on Nepali subjects. Manipuri has 7 ETDs, Bengali has 5 ETDs, Oriya has 3 ETDs, Kannada has 3 ETDs, Arabic has 2 ETDs, Tenyidie has 2 ETDs, Khasi has 2 ETDs, French has 2 ETDs, Tamil has 1 ETD, Spanish has 1 ETD, and the Far East has 1 ETD. The diversity of research contributions in this collection is evident in the various languages and their respective languages.

Language-Wise Distribution of No. ETDs




Figure 3: Comprehensive Overview of the Linguistic Distributions of ETDs

The total number of ETDs is 940, with English being the predominant language. 




Figure 4: Comprehensive Overview of the Linguistic Distributions of ETDs

The number of ETDs on Shodhganga indicates research activity, with Manipur and Mizoram being notable for their substantial number. The data also highlights the linguistic and regional diversity of research conducted in Central Universities, with various languages and disciplines represented. The results provide a comprehensive overview of Central Universities in India, highlighting their significant role in the country's academic landscape and their research productivity. It also offers insights into the nature and diversity of academic research in India, requiring further analysis and exploration of their ETDs.

Conclusion: Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETDs) on Shodhganga in 2022 reveals English as the

predominant language, with 793 documents, indicating its global importance in academic communication.

The table also highlights the rich linguistic and cultural diversity in academic research, with languages like Hindi, Sanskrit, Nepali, Manipuri, and Bengali contributing to the collection. The ETDs on Shodhganga include a diverse range of languages, including fewer common ones like Tenyidie, Khasi, and Arabic, as well as international languages like French and Spanish. This diversity highlights the inclusivity of research and the contributions of scholars from various linguistic backgrounds. English remains the dominant language for academic discourse, emphasizing its global reach and accessibility. This data offers valuable insights into the

linguistic dimensions of academic research in India.
